LIQUOR AUTHORITY

TO: Wholesalers of Liquor, Wine and Beer
SUBJECT: Sales to Embassies, Legations, United Nations and
Delegations to the United Nations

At its meeting of July 28, and 29, 1953, the Authority ordered that Bulletin 173 issued on September 8, 1948 and amended on August 29, 1949, February 8, 1952 and July 8, 1952, be rescinded.


The Authority further ordered that wholesalers of liquor, wine and beer may, without further authorization from the Authority but upon compliance with appropriate rules or regulations of any other governmental agencies, sell alcoholic beverages stored in a United States Custom Bonded Warehouse to any of the following:

1. Ambassadors and minister plenipotentiary to the United States;
2. The United Nations as an organization, to the permanent representatives of foreign nations to the United Nations and members of their staffs entitled to diplomatic privileges and immunities, and to the United States Mission to the United Nations.
3. Consuls and accredited members of their staffs, in instances where they are entitled to special privileges and immunities by virtue of treaties of reciprocity between their countries and the United States or by virtue of reciprocal customs agreements effected by exchange of notes between their countries and the United States.

Manufacturers and wholesalers making such sales are required to keep a record of such transactions, which records must be available for inspection by duly accredited representatives of the Authority.

Provisions of any bulletin heretofore issued by the Authority which are in conflict with this bulletin are hereby rescinded.
